- Memorize at least 2–3 points. Speak naturally — don't just recite.

Q: Why do you want to join TCS?

TCS is not just an IT company — it is a global brand backed by the reputation of Tata Group. Due to the presence of numerous projects across diverse domains, I will get exposure to cutting-edge technologies and the chance to develop versatile skills. TCS's commitment to continuous learning through platforms like TCS iON and Fresco Play aligns perfectly with my growth mindset. The global scale of TCS means I can work across geographies and industries, which is something I deeply aspire to. Moreover, TCS is widely respected in society — my family would be proud to know I am working with such a reputed organization.

- Add a personal touch — mention a domain (e.g., banking tech, AI) if you have a genuine interest.

Q: Are you okay with relocation?

Yes, absolutely. I understand that TCS operates across multiple cities and countries, and I am flexible to relocate wherever the project or business need requires. I see relocation as a growth opportunity, not a constraint.

SECTION 3: TOP 25 TCS HR INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Q1. Introduce yourself / Tell me something about yourself.

Cover: Name → Education → Technical Skills → Projects/Internship → Hobbies/Strengths → Short & Long-term Goals. Keep it to 1–2 minutes. Be confident, structured, and don't just read your resume aloud. End with your aim at TCS.

■ *Structure: Who am I → What I know → What I've done → What I want.*

Q2. Why should we hire you?

I am a quick learner with strong fundamentals in programming and problem-solving. I may not have industry experience yet, but I have the ability to learn fast, adapt to new challenges, and contribute meaningfully from day one. I am disciplined, trustworthy, a team player, and committed to delivering quality within deadlines. I thrive in challenging environments and will give my 100% to the organisation's success.

■ *Show hunger to learn + team mindset + reliability. Avoid being arrogant.*

Q3. What is your greatest strength?

My greatest strength is my ability to adapt quickly and learn continuously. Whenever I face an unfamiliar topic, I break it down systematically and find the best solution. Combined with good communication and a positive attitude, this helps me work effectively in teams and deliver results.

■ *Give a real example to back up your strength.*

Q4. What is your greatest weakness?

I sometimes spend too much time perfecting a task rather than moving forward. However, I have been actively working on this by setting time-boxes for tasks and prioritizing outcomes over perfection. This has helped me become more efficient while maintaining quality.

■ *Always end your weakness with what you're doing to improve it.*

Q5. What are your short-term and long-term goals?

Short-term: To join TCS, complete onboarding training successfully, master the technology stack relevant to my project, and contribute meaningfully within the first 6 months. Long-term: To grow into a senior technical role, lead projects, and eventually take on client-facing responsibilities in a global setting.

■ *Align your goals with TCS's growth path — shows you've thought long term.*

Q6. Who inspired you to become an engineer?

Give a genuine answer — a family member, a teacher, a tech icon, or a personal experience. Connect it to how that inspiration has shaped your academic and career choices.

■ *Be authentic. Interviewers can tell if you're fabricating inspiration.*

Q7. What are your extra-curricular activities?

Mention activities that show leadership, teamwork, or creativity — hackathons, coding competitions, NSS/NCC, sports, college clubs. Have a specific achievement ready for at least one activity.

■ *Don't list activities you can't speak about. Quality over quantity.*

Q8. Are you a team player? Give an example.

Always answer Yes with an example. E.g., 'During our final year project, our team had a tight deadline. I took initiative to divide tasks based on individual strengths, coordinated daily stand-ups, and we

successfully delivered on time. I believe collaboration drives better outcomes than solo effort.'

■ *Have a STAR-format story ready: Situation → Task → Action → Result.*

Q9. What is more important — money or work?

Both are important, but at this stage of my career, I prioritize the quality of work, learning, and the environment over money. I believe if I perform well and grow professionally, financial rewards will follow naturally. TCS's structured growth path gives me confidence in this.

■ *Never say 'only money' — it's a red flag. Show maturity.*

Q10. If you are rejected today, what will you do?

I will not be disheartened. Rejection is redirection. I will introspect on the areas where I could have performed better, work on those gaps, and come back stronger. Every failure teaches something valuable.

■ *Stay positive. Show resilience and self-awareness.*

Q11. Tell me about your dream job.

My dream job is one where I can solve real-world problems using technology, work with a talented and diverse team, and continuously grow. A role at TCS perfectly aligns with this — diverse clients, global exposure, and a culture of learning make it close to my ideal professional environment.

■ *Align your dream job description to what TCS actually offers.*

Q12. Are you willing to work overtime / night shifts / weekends?

Yes, I understand that IT projects sometimes demand flexible working hours to meet client deadlines. I am fully prepared to work overtime or in shifts when required. I do not have any personal constraints that would prevent this.

■ *Show flexibility and commitment — TCS works across global time zones.*

Q13. Would you be willing to relocate to any part of the country?

Absolutely. I believe new locations bring new experiences and I am excited about the possibility of working in different cities or even abroad. I am fully prepared to relocate.

Q14. If given another area like maintenance or analysis, will you work?

Yes, I am open to working in any department TCS assigns me to. Every domain has its own learning curve and value. I will give my best regardless of the area.

Q15. Tell me 2 reasons why we should NOT hire you.

1. I am a fresher, so you would need to invest time in training me initially. However, I guarantee I will be a fast learner and a high performer. 2. I prefer companies that value hard work and dedication — if TCS only wants people who do the bare minimum, I may not fit. But I know TCS values excellence, which is exactly why I'm here.

■ *Turn perceived weaknesses into strengths. Don't be self-deprecating.*

Q16. What do you know about TCS as a company?

TCS was founded on April 1, 1968 by Jamsetji Tata and F.C. Kohli. It is a subsidiary of Tata Sons, headquartered in Mumbai. TCS has 600,000+ employees across 55+ countries, with revenue exceeding \$29B in FY2024. The current CEO is K. Krithivasan and Chairman is N. Chandrasekaran. TCS's values include integrity, respect, excellence, and learning & sharing.

■ *Know the CEO, revenue, founding year, values, and recent news. Basics are non-negotiable.*

Q17. Who are TCS's competitors?

Global IT competitors: Accenture, Infosys, Wipro, HCL Technologies, Cognizant, Capgemini, IBM Global Services, Deloitte Digital, Tech Mahindra. Indian market: Infosys, Wipro, HCL are the closest competitors.

Q18. Who is the founder of Google? / Who invented WWW?

Google was founded by Larry Page and Sergey Brin in 1998. The World Wide Web (WWW) was invented by Tim Berners-Lee in 1989. The full form of 4G is 'Fourth Generation' mobile network.

■ *Common GK questions — prepare a few basic facts on tech inventions.*

Q19. Can you swap two numbers without using a third variable?

Yes! Using arithmetic: $a = a + b$; $b = a - b$; $a = a - b$. Or using XOR: $a = a \oplus b$; $b = a \oplus b$; $a = a \oplus b$. Both methods swap values without a temporary variable.

■ *If asked to demonstrate on paper, do it step by step and explain each line.*

Q20. What algorithm would you use for bubble sort?

Bubble sort is a simple comparison-based algorithm. We repeatedly step through the list, compare adjacent elements, and swap them if they're in the wrong order. Time Complexity: $O(n^2)$ in the worst case. Space: $O(1)$. It is not efficient for large datasets but easy to understand.

■ *Know at least 3 sorting algorithms with their time complexities for TCS.*

Q21. Where are TCS's major offices in India?

Mumbai (HQ — 17+ campuses), Bangalore (5 campuses), Chennai (11 campuses), Kolkata (9 campuses), Pune (7 campuses), Hyderabad, Delhi/Noida, Ahmedabad, Goa. TCS also has offices in Bhubaneswar, Jaipur, Lucknow, and Thiruvananthapuram.

Q22. Tell us the financial condition of India.

India is the world's 5th largest economy by nominal GDP (~\$3.7 Trillion, 2024). It is 3rd by Purchasing Power Parity (PPP). GDP growth rate: ~7.2% (FY2024) — one of the fastest growing major economies. GDP per capita: ~\$2,600 (nominal). India's nominal GDP is projected to reach \$5 Trillion by 2026–27.

■ *Keep these stats updated before your interview.*

Q23. Why not higher studies?

I have thoroughly assessed my goals and I believe practical industry experience at a global company like TCS will accelerate my growth far more than continuing academia at this stage. I plan to pursue certifications and online learning in parallel to keep upgrading my knowledge.

■ *If you genuinely plan higher studies later, don't mention it here.*

Q24. Have you discussed this job with your family?

Yes, I have. My family is fully supportive of my decision to join TCS. They understand the value of working with a reputed company like TCS and are proud of the opportunity.

Q25. What were you doing for the past 6 months? (if there's a gap)

Be honest. If you were studying, mention exams and certifications. If preparing for placements, say so. Mention any projects, freelance work, online courses (Coursera, NPTEL, Udemy), or competitive coding practice.

■ *Never lie about a gap. Justify it productively.*

SECTION 5: TCS SELECTION PROCESS & HR ROUND

TCS NQT Selection Process

Round 1 — TCS NQT (Online Test): Reasoning → Verbal → Quantitative → Programming Logic → Coding (2 questions)

Round 2 — Technical Round (TR): Data Structures, OOP, DBMS, OS, Networking, Projects, Resume-based coding questions

Round 3 — Managerial Round (MR): Problem-solving, situational judgment, project deep-dive, communication

Round 4 — HR Round (HR): Personality, attitude, company knowledge, relocation, salary discussion, behavioral questions

Documents to Carry for TCS Interview

- Coloured printout of TCS Application Form (1 copy)
- Updated Resume (1 copy — max 2 pages, no need to be fancy)
- Any valid Government Photo ID (Aadhaar, PAN, Passport, etc.)
- All original mark sheets and certificates
- Printout of the interview call email/letter from TCS

Resume Tips for TCS

- Keep it simple and clean — 1 page preferred, max 2 pages.
- Include: Personal details, Career Objective, Education, Technical Skills, Projects, Certifications, Achievements, Hobbies.
- Technical Skills: Java or Python as primary language. Mention DBMS, OS, Networking if studied.
- Mention 2–3 well-explained projects — at least one should be from your major/final year.
- Do NOT include fake skills or projects — interviewers will ask you about anything on your resume.
- Ensure your CGPA, percentage, and dates are consistent across all documents.

HR Round: Do's and Don'ts

Do's:

- Speak in English if possible — use correct grammar and clear pronunciation.
- Dress formally — first impressions are lasting.
- Carry a physical notebook and pen.
- Research TCS thoroughly — CEO, values, recent news, services.
- Prepare a 1–2 minute introduction in advance.
- Listen carefully before answering — don't interrupt.
- Ask 1 intelligent question at the end: e.g., 'What skills should I focus on before joining?'

Don'ts:

- Don't badmouth previous companies or colleges.
- Don't lie about your skills or experience.

- Don't mention salary as your top priority.
- Don't be too casual — maintain professionalism.
- Don't memorize robotic answers — speak naturally.
- Don't arrive late — reach 30 minutes early.

Introduce Yourself — Structure

- Name, native place, and a brief mention of what it's known for.
 - Educational background — college, branch, CGPA.
 - Technical skills and programming languages.
 - Academic projects or internship experience.
 - Certifications, achievements, and awards.
 - Hobbies and extra-curricular activities.
 - Short-term and long-term goals.
 - Why TCS (optional but impactful if added naturally at the end).
- *Practice your intro out loud 5–10 times. Time yourself — aim for 90–120 seconds.*
